RACE CLASSES

1/8th scale nitro, 1/8th scale electric (FE), 1/6.67th scale gas (Gas Scale), 1/10th scale electric*

*1/10th scale electric will contest under R/CU's "Invitation to Race Policy" and will race assuming there are at least 3 entries.

RACE FORMAT

All classes will have 4 preliminary heats.

1/8th scale nitro and 1/8th scale electric: Top 6 boats make the final. Next 5 boats make the 1st consolation, with the winner advancing to the final as a trailer. Next 6 boats make the 2nd consolation, with the winner advancing to the 1st consolation. Second consolation race will be optional and confirmed during drivers' meeting depending on boat count.

Gas Scale: Top 5 boats make the final. Next 5 boats make the 1st consolation, with the winner advancing to the final as a trailer. Next 6 boats make the 2nd consolation, with the winner advancing to the 1st consolation. Second consolation race will be optional and confirmed during drivers' meeting depending on boat count.

1/10th scale electric: To be determined during drivers' meeting. Possibly 4 preliminary heats, final standings based on accumulated point totals throughout the day.

RACE REGISTRATION COSTS

A driver is allowed to submit multiple entries in any class. First entry is \$20, with any additional entry is \$5 (regardless of class). Race entries are paid Sunday morning via cash (please bring exact change) or credit card.

NEW BOATS

As a reminder, the R/CU rulebook states that new boats must be inspected and complete 5 laps to transition from developmental status to competition status, and this process cannot occur on the day of the race (Sunday). Please contact R/CU inspector, Paxton Reunanen, for any exemptions or questions regarding this.

NEW DRIVERS

It is heavily encouraged that drivers that have not competed in R/CU before attend Saturday practice to become qualified as a new driver.

SCHEDULE REVISIONS

We've seen a lot of boats entered in the first two races of the year, which is great! However, we are aware that this leads to a long day at the pond, and late nights arriving back home. Please note that testing will end at 9:30 AM on Sunday morning, as opposed to our typical time of 10:00 AM. Please note that second consolation races could get dropped from the schedule if there are many boats entered; this will be determined during the drivers' meeting. Please note that 1/10th scale electric could be a total points race based on 4 heats; this will be determined during the drivers' meeting.

TRAILER TOWING FOR THE PRESIDENT'S CUP

We are still looking for volunteers to tow the R/CU trailer from the east side of the state to the west side in preparation for the upcoming President's Cup in Tacoma, on June 5. This does not have to occur on Sunday night, but does need to occur before or on June 5. Please note that R/CU does have a storage facility in Ellensburg, so an option would be to have a volunteer tow it from the Tri-Cities to Ellensburg, and another volunteer tow it from Ellensburg to the westside/Tacoma. Following the President's Cup, it will need to be towed back to Ellensburg.

Towing the R/CU trailer is a paid position at \$1 per mile and a free entry (\$20) into the next race.

If the trailer cannot be relocated to the westside for the Tacoma race, there will be no race.
